The President's Hatch

Last Flyline, I mentioned I was working on a boat restoration project. Around a year ago we found out my great grandfather's Naden boat was being sold by the previous owner. Naden boats were manufactured in Webster City throughout the mid 1900's and this model was likely a late 50's to early 60's version. The boat made its way out of the family a few decades ago and we knew it was in disrepair prior to re-purchasing. My uncle, Bill, bought the boat anticipating a total reconstruction. That assumption was correct as the only functioning portion of the boat was the shell itself. Even the transom needed fully rebuilt.

Bill had his own boat, so someone else in the family needed to take on the project and give it a permanent home once finished. We hatched the idea to restore the boat as a family and then I'd keep the vessel as a family heirloom. The only stipulation was that the boat would be modified to perform "modern" functions for a fly angler. Think of things like an open casting deck, stabilizing the interior of the craft for balance mid-cast, adding advanced electronics to properly utilize heavy sinking lines in deep water on still lakes, and more. With all parties in agreement, we immediately got to work making it the perfect lake - fly fishing vessel. Over five months of hard work went into restoration, and we finally finished on November 3rd. The three of us met religiously every Sunday morning during that time to make it all come together.

While I'd like to say my dad and I helped with the construction, and we certainly did, the genius behind the operation was the master carpenter i.e. Uncle Bill. When it comes to craftsmanship, he is the best. Most of his professional woodworking can be found in luxury homes around Iowa where he creates things like custom cabinets, framing, wood flooring, gun rooms, tables, chandeliers, and more. His creations are unique, and the completed products find their way into the homes of interesting individuals. For example, he did a substantial amount of woodwork in Dennis

Albaugh's first Ankeny home. While we were working on the boat, he also wrapped up a brand-new gun room project for an attorney. The room featured a nearly complete collection of mint condition Winchester firearms. Bill created the ornamental cabinetry in which those guns were later stored. Dad and I loved the stories that went with his projects.

It was a unique and humbling experience to watch Bill frame the entirety of the boat from start to finish. I told him what I wanted, and his brain created it. I was astonished at how simple he made the entire process look. Dad and I, intentionally, did no woodworking. We were both horrible at it. Carpeting the entirety of the boat, buffing out salvageable aluminum parts, placing stainless steel screws and accessories, ordering and picking up the new trailer, picking up day to day supplies, hiring out the paint job duties, cleaning, and comedic relief were more so our responsibilities.

When the project was completed in its entirety, we were left with the perfect fly-fishing boat. A new trolling motor and electronics, flush components on the front of the casting deck to avoid fly line hang ups, recessed center walkway where the bench was removed for more walking

space, and a brand-new paint job brought it all together. We even tricked it out with the original decals to complete the "old school" aesthetic. It really does serve as my ideal fishing boat for small Iowa lakes, but also accommodates my family for leisurely weekend floats.

I'm looking forward to bagging a few jumbo hybrid striped bass, bluegills, bowfin, and smallmouth bass in this watercraft. The spring season will also allow me to modify a few pieces in preparation for my first "select-trip" season. These will be single angler trips dedicated to targeting trophy fish only (bowfin, hybrid striped bass, carp, and panoptix-panfish). Mainly for my friends and family members, but public interest is always there if big fish are involved.

More importantly, I'm glad we were able to complete this project as a family. As silly as it seems, being in the company of one another and completing a project together strengthened our relationships. This boat was an important part of my dad and uncle's upbringings. They spent countless hours inside the vessel learning to fish. Rebuilding their childhood was obviously important to them, and to me, so I was honored to be a part of it all. I never met my great grandfather, but I've now got a part of him forever! Sentimental, and a great addition to the fishing arsenal. Hopefully you all get the chance to take on rare projects like this in the future. If you get the opportunity, take advantage. As painstaking as it seems to restore an entire boat, I enjoyed the process from start to finish. Seeing my great grandfather's old boat go from a shell of itself to "straight off the lot" beautiful was more than rewarding. Chat with me at the spring show if you'd like more details. For now, I've got some late season fishing to accomplish. Tight lines to you all and see you in February!

HFFA Board Meeting Minutes
October 19, 2024
Manchester Fish Hatchery

Meeting called to order by President Davis Horton at 12:00 PM

- Welcome from Davis Horton
- A motion was made and unanimously approved to accept minutes from the last board meeting
- Keith Wunder, Treasurer reported the current bank balance, deer tag receipts, and the year to date 2025 show expenses. A motion was made and unanimously approved to accept the financial report.
- 2025 Show Report
 - Dave Jones introduced the show committee; co-chairs Dave Jones & Rob Kundert, registration coordinator Ronda Long, vendor/exhibitor coordinator John Miller, raffle & silent auction coordinator Kate Lodge, fly tyer coordinator Patrick Burns and set up coordinator John Channon. The 2025 HFFA Show will be held February 21-23, 2025. The committee reported that the venue and pricing commitment have been made with the Hyatt Regency in Coralville. - Funding request for Burr Oak Creek stream land acquisition
 - Verbal funding request of \$1,000 was received from Cameron Acker, Trout Unlimited Iowa Driftless Outreach Coordinator, to assist with the land acquisition cost for Burr Oak Creek trout stream. The board supported the request but delayed a vote until a funding request form had been completed and submitted.
- Bloody Run funding request of \$1,000 for water testing supplies was discuss at length. While the board understands the need for water testing, an indirect association by funding a group who may potentially bring suit against the DNR could jeopardize HFFA's relationship with the DNR, posing a risk to future stream project cooperation and deer tag revenue as a major source of funding. After further discussion, the motion to fund the water testing supplies was denied.

HFFA Annual Meeting & Show Speakers



George Daniel was six when he tried fly fishing on the native brook trout stream near his home village in Potter County, Pennsylvania. The stretch of stream was designated a “kids only section,” which gave him the freedom to practice...a lot. Self-taught for a good part of a decade, at fourteen his family moved to central Pennsylvania. At a local fly shop, he connected with the man he considers his fly fishing idol, Joe Humphreys. Taking George under his wing, Humphreys began mentoring him, creating a foundation that would lead to more formalized instruction. At 16, Humphreys expanded his education into all levels, from the basic cast to advanced nymphing casts. To this day, George credits Humphreys for the bulk of his knowledge while acknowledging the many national and international fly fishing professionals who have contributed to his knowledge and experience.

George went on to qualify for Fly Fishing Team USA in Bend, Oregon. He competed in five World Fly Fishing Championships and coached both the US Youth Team and Fly Fishing Team USA in four World Championships. The experience allowed him to travel the globe and learn from many of the best anglers in the world. A two-time US National Fly Fishing Champion, ranking as high as 5th in the world, George continued to win or achieve respectable finishes in other fly fishing competitions. But his true passion is fly fishing education. Appearing at clubs and fly fishing shows around the country, George conducts lectures and seminars while still logging more than 280 days a year on waters near and far. George is currently the director/lead instructor for the Pennsylvania State University Fly Fishing Program.



After mysteriously losing all of his dad’s lures in a single day, Charlie Craven was gifted a fly tying kit by his parents for his eighth birthday. He’s tied flies pretty much every day for the forty years since then and has figured out a few things pertaining to fur, feathers, and fish along the way. At this point, it’s becoming well known that he’s opinionated, outspoken and sometimes brash when it comes to flies and techniques but his passion lies in sharing the skills he’s developed.

Over the years, Charlie has been a prolific commercial fly tyer and, for a time, a pretty mediocre fishing guide, due to his insistence on liverwurst and onion lunch sandwiches instead of grilled prawns like all the other sissy guides.

He’s been an Umpqua Feather Merchants Signature Tyer for over 18 years with several fly box mainstays like the Juju Baetis, Two Bit Hooker and Baby Gongga among his over two dozen commercially available patterns. All this experience finally culminated in 2004 with the opening of his own fly shop, Charlie’s Fly Box, in Arvada, Colorado, where he is the head bookkeeper, order taker and fry cook in addition to president and CEO. He’s written three books, Charlie Craven’s Basic Fly Tying, Charlie’s Fly Box and Tying Nymphs with plans for several more when he gets around to them.

After beating Ross Purnell in a prolonged and brutal arm wrestling match, he became the Fly Tyer’s Bench columnist for Fly Fisherman Magazine and still maintains this title to this day. He was recently named to that magazine’s 50 Most Influential People in Fly Fishing, and it is thought that his number 45 ranking was specifically chosen to keep his head from growing any larger.

Charlie lives in the hills of Palmer Lake, Colorado with his lucky, patient and loving wife, Lisa, their two gigantic dogs and somewhere between three and six young adult children. He still likes quiet time, the Parachute Adams, Colorado whiskey and dry-dropper fishing from a boat. His favorite number is five and his favorite color is red and he doesn’t care what yours are. “It’s not simply enough that a fly catches fish, it has to do all that’s asked of it, well....and style matters”^[1]_[SEP]

Iowa's 11th annual Casting for Recovery retreat was held over a long weekend, culminating on Sunday, October 6th. Participants spent most of their time with volunteers at Ewalu Stone Retreat Center, Strawberry Point, Iowa, learning such things as tying knots, fly casting skills, and about the trout's diet in the stream environment.

On Sunday, each lady was paired up with a volunteer river guide, enjoying guided fly fishing for up to 1/2 day at Backbone State Park or the Maquoketa River. All participants and volunteers then returned to the center for lunch and a fun program. Each participant had the opportunity to speak about their river helper and their experience together on the water.

Casting for Recovery (CFR), is a national organization whose mission is to "enhance the lives of women with breast cancer by connecting them to each other and nature through the therapeutic sport of fly fishing." The retreat is available to women who have or who have had breast cancer and is available at no cost to them. Volunteers include medical and psychosocial professionals as well as fly fishing instructors.
