I tried to get a picture of just the display and had to go back into the DNR building a half dozen times to find no one standing by it. We had a lot of kids fly casting with us before the event, many questions, and a large crowd. I'll admit it. I have always been a little jealous of the eastern lowa clubs being closer to trout water and more quality smallmouth water. Life got busy this summer and I have only been up to driftless for a few days with my weekends typically only having 6-hour time slots free. No one is going to feel sorry for me and my "first world" problem. I have some quality time booked in the driftless in the coming weeks and bags already half packed.

Most areas of driftless have come out of the long drought and the springs in northeast lowa have gotten some muchneeded refreshes. This should lead to some great fall fishing.

In central lowa fishing will improve as the water levels drop. This time of year, historically some central lowa members target white bass and wipers on the Des Moines River, Saylorville, Red Rock, and Big Creek Lake. There is something special about seeing a school of wipers slamming shad with violent explosions on the surface. Shad induced nervous water is its own form of a "hatch" and can be just as memorable as a mayfly or caddis hatch. Sometimes these events are obvious with seagulls hovering and rioting in a feeding frenzy or you will even see shad being pushed out of the water. Hope everyone can get out and fish this

month!

HFFA Business Report

Hawkeye Fly Fishing Association Meeting Minutes (7/9/25)

Location: Zoom

Meeting called to order at 6:00pm

Those present were: Kirk Rosenow, Dale Tayloe, Rhonda Long, Ron Stahlberg, Partick Burns, Rob Kundert, Martin Acerbo, Don Otto, Marty McVey, Ryan Maas, and Cameron Akers. Absent: Davis Horton.

New Business

- 1) Treasurer's report- Rhonda gave highlights of the Treasurer's report (outlined in her earlier 9Jul email). There was discussion regarding 2 signers of checks of \$1000 or more, a process with which Ronda will proceed.
- 2) Social Media- Kirk began a discussion on HFFA social media strategy. (i.e. What is our strategy? What should it be?) There is a survey going to board members via email by Marty. Please fill out and return to Marty for analysis and conclusions. Don Otto pointed out there is a basic need for information flow from members attending events or promoting causes somehow relating to fly fishing to persons who post on social media. This is fundamental to any HFFA social media strategy/policy.
- 3) Spring Branch Project- Cameron discussed scope and likely cost of the project. Cameron agreed to send email outlining the project with maps and diagrams to board members. Attachments include an invitation to the general membership which Don agreed to post on HFFA website. Ronda will seek completion and keep on file the completed financial request forms for this and other projects. Form is available on the website for anyone seeking financial help from HFFA.
- 4) Local Club Dynamics- Requests have come from the general membership for changes in how HFFA interacts with local chapters. The board notes that local chapter dynamics have changed in the last 20-30 years. Local chapters may be less formal and more social in nature but no less dedicated to the conservation, preservation, and the sport of fly fishing. At this time, the board chooses to take no action. The board does not wish to require reporting structure or place requirements on local clubs/chapters/groups in fostering participation, growth, and development for fly fishing, conservation, or the preservation of fisheries. The board realizes more effort must be made in the planning, arranging for, and the execution of the annual business meeting held during the annual show.
- 5) Fly Tying Contest at Iowa State Fair/Large flies- Currently entries for contest must be sizes 2-18 per contest rules. There is, however, apparent interest in tying larger streamers (including those large, colorful, articulating streamers) by our membership and by younger tyers in particular. Kirk will consult with those in charge of the contest about this as a possible additional category for next year's fair.
- 6) Upcoming Events
 - a)Cameron- 19Aug....workday project (bank hides) at Manchester Fish Hatchery, 9am -12pm followed by stream cleanup.
 - b)Kirk- 14Aug...HFFA presentation at DNR courtyard, Iowa State Fair at 3pm. Fly tying contest results will be posted and displayed there; judges have been selected. If interested in helping out, contact Kirk.

Meeting called to order at 6:00pm

Those present: Kirk Rosenow, Dale Tayloe, Rhonda Long, Ron Stahlberg, Partick Burns, Martin Acerbo, Don Otto, and Cameron Akers. Absent: Davis Horton Marty McVey, Ryan Maas,

New Business

- 1) Treasurer's report- Rhonda gave highlights of the Treasurer's report (emailed earlier this day, 20Aug). Motion by Dale to accept Treasurer's Report. Second by Kirk. Motion passed.
- 2) Annual Show update- Mike Jacobs sent a show status update to Kirk. Mike and the show committee are feeling good about preparations and status in general. Main speakers are Jason Randall and Jeff Currier. Hospitality room will be open and well provisioned both Friday and Saturday night. Fly Fishing Film Tour will be shown on Sunday afternoon and should boost Sunday attendance.
- Spring Branch Project- Cameron discussed again the scope and likely cost of the project. The contractors for the project have been selected and some rock has been moved already. Total expected cost of project is \$10-12K. Cam has completed HFFA form asking for \$5K and Ronda has form on file. Remainder of funds will come for Iowa Coldwater Conservatory, the landowner, Buchanan County Conservation, and others. The project is expected to take 3 days of work with finishing touches by mid-September. This is a highly used stretch of stream and there is high confidence the planned changes will improve the stream as a fishery. Motion by Dale for HFFA to provide \$5K for the Tibbett Easement/Spring Branch Project as outlined by Cameron. Second by Martin. There was discussion of forthcoming projects and expected revenue in 2026. There was also discussion of what minimum amount cash HFFA should retain on hand for possible forthcoming projects. Cameron noted that he could install signage noting the organizations that donated to the project. Motion passed.
- 4) Miscellaneous- 17 people helped build 18 bank hides in 3 hours at Spring Branch workday; suggestion made to use Face-book to thank participants. Photos that "tell a story" taken at events such as the Spring Branch event, should be sent to The Fly Line editor at hawkeyeflyfisher.com or diottovet@gmail.com for possible inclusion in The Fly Line.

Motion to adjourn by Dale at approximately 6:50pm. Second by Kirk. Motion passed.



2025 Iowa State Fair Fly Tying Competition Results by James Barnhart

The fly-tying competition was held at the 2025 Iowa State Fair. This competition has been developed and sponsored by the Hawkeye Fly Fishing Association (HFFA) with support of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). There were 25 entrants with 73 flies entered into the competition from across the state. There were 7 in the junior division (ranging in age from 14 to 5), 16 in the adult division, and 2 in the expert division. There are four categories; dry flies, wet/nymph flies, streamer flies, and open. There are 3 divisions (Expert, Adult and Junior). The judging took place at the State Fair on Wednesday, August 6th.

This year's judges (shown in photo below left to right) were Lee Schulteis (Perry), Joe Wedum (Des Moines), and Paul Domoto (Ames). James Barnhart is at far right in the photo. The flies were on display in the DNR building on the fairgrounds during the entire fair.

"Facing Down the Skunk"

I'm intrigued by how often the skunk appears in fly fishing literature. Fly fishing author Erik Helm penned an enjoyable essay about the skunk which recently piqued my interest again. The skunk always seems to be out there and frequently enjoys putting fishermen into a frazzle. Even a well known steelhead fly pattern, "the skunk", particularly the "green butt skunk", is part of our lexicon.

A fishing day may start by launching our boat, or taking the first step into the pond or stream, brimming with confidence, only to find that nothing in our fly box interests the fish. There is also the "first cast hooks a nice fish" phenomena that instructs all other fish that day to ignore your most skillful casting and beautifully constructed flies. "Hook a fish on your first cast and you may as well go home." as Kelly Galloup says, "or make your first cast into a tree." The skunk is unseen but giggling behind you somewhere.

We believe the clichés that our sport is "fishing versus catching" and even a "bad day fishing is better than a good day at work". How intriguing would our sport be if we caught a fish on every cast? Maybe a little skunk can be a good thing..... Still, we would like to bring a fish to net and even suffer catching a couple dinks rather than be completely shut out.

The skunk can cause fishless minutes often stretching into fishless hours (and even fishless days and months for some species). We try to make excuses for our lack of success. It was too windy, it was too still and hot, too cloudy, too much glare. The water was too low and clear, it was too high and muddy. You brought the wrong fly box, and they're eating only size 28 midges. Or I wore the wrong fishing cap because my lowa State grad fishing partner forbids me to wear my Hawkeye camouflage cap on his boat......

So how do we deal with the skunk? Number one: you don't end the skunk by staying home. "Ascertain the prevailing conditions" as Davy Wotton says. You have pounded the riffles, so fish the frog water. Take a break, have a sandwich and think it through. Watch the eagles. Change flies, a different color or pattern. Outright challenge the critter by tying on a variation of the green butt skunk fly. Downsize the fly or put on that big articulated killer. Resort to superstitions. Attempt to banish the skunk by chanting voodoo phrases learned from a YouTube witch. Change to a different cap and hide your current lucky one until you catch a "good" fish. Promise your buddy you won't cuss any more on this trip. Consider just going bluegill fishing.

Lately the skunk has been a pernicious accompanist to the Angry Ames Anglers participation in the annual Musky Premier Flyfishing tournament near Hayward, Wisconsin. To sheepishly summarize, we have only caught one measurable musky in the nine years of the tourney. Richard caught it. One musky. Try to explain that to your wife...... We know it is the skunk. The skunk must have sneaked aboard the boat somewhere between Ames and Hayward, perhaps when we made a lunch stop near Spooner. He was not only with our team last fall, but he infected most of the other 49 teams because only 24 fish from 25" to 43" were caught by 14 of the 50 teams over two days. That is a lot of casting hours and points to 36 teams being completely shut down (i.e. "skunked") by the cunning varmint. The tourney was won by two brothers who caught two muskies, a 43 inch fish on Friday and a 38 inch fish on Saturday. Good for the Anderson brothers. They deserved to quash the skunk. Hopefully though, next year the Angry Ames Anglers can outflank the skunk and move up the leader board.

"With Love, to My Aunt Mary Joan"

Around 8 pm on June 14, 2024, the musky goes vertical, fully freeing itself from the water into an 80° day, yet the pink and white fly sticks like a tick in the right corner of it's mouth.

Two nights beforehand, my guide and friend, MG, called and said lightning was still flashing, with more rain expected. I could hear frogs in the background. I was told that it was my choice, but the conditions were still poor. Water was either going to be high and dirty (not good) or high and clear (worse). He was not optimistic- repeatedly saying it was a long way to go for one day of fishing, but he understood the itch...

The morning of June 13th, the water stats had changed very little on the USGS site. Previously, my June 10th trip had been canceled due to higher water and then illness in my family. I texted him. My only regret would be if I didn't go.

MG sees the fish strike; I simply see the water erupt, but I definitely feel it hit. I give 2 hard strip sets, make myself relax and keep line tension. Musky moves right, rod goes left. Let line out but give no slack during the run, then strip the fish back in. It's suddenly, vertically, and completely out of the water. Wow-she's big! Thinking, Don't throw the hook! Keep calm. Listen to my friend - my guide, while he is also rowing the boat out of the current. Give her line on another run, strip her back, rod tip left, now hammer down on the tension!, rod tip lower to control that big head. Lift the rod tip up, head goes up (she's heavy!), and he slips the net under and then around her. She is netted and can now rest in calm water.

For a moment, we sit back in mutual relief and then our happiness comes rushing in. I'm a bit choked up. I said to MG that I'd hoped to catch a musky in honor of my aunt who'd died earlier that week. She grew up when it wasn't common for women to fish and hike. She'd often told me that she'd wished she'd been "brave" like me. I'd been able to see her that last time and tell her I loved her and didn't know anyone stronger than her. When I briefly feel the heft of that glorious musky in my hands during the photos taken that will forever remind me of this day, I quickly look up to the sky, give thanks, and softly say, "In honor of you, Aunt Mary Joan!"

A mid-30s musky bested me earlier that day. The water was high and dirty with slim opportunity for a second chance, but we surely got it. Before releasing her, MG and I hold her in the water, confirming my new PB by taping the musky out at 45 inches!

The musky is released. After a while, MG smokes a cigarette. We share (just a little) tequila, reliving the excitement. We like it high and dirty here, somewhere north of Illinois. It's the only respectable way, and also the finest way, to have a threesome.

The Fly Tying & Fly Casting Event sponsored by Johnston Public Library, North Bear Trout Unlimited, & Central Iowa Fly Fishers was held on June 7, 2025. There was a very good turnout of 18 participants and about 8 instructors. The session started with the librarian welcoming all to the library and wishing them good luck. Jay Leach, president of NBTU, then explained how fly casting and fly fishing differed from spin casting. Jay split the participants into two groups, one for casting and one for tying. Jay took the group for casting out to the yard behind the library. He demonstrated the roll cast and the basic pickup and lay down cast. Inside the fly tying instructors were helping that group with the basics of fly tying. The two groups switched places after an hour. Several of the folks that tied first took their fly to the pond to try for some willing pan fish, after receiving the casting instruction. A good time was had by all. Fortunately the rain held off except for a few sprinkles.

HFFA Activities







On Saturday, August 16th, Hawkeye Fly Fishers and Trout Unlimited partnered to assemble 18 bank hides that will be used on trout stream restoration projects in 2025 and 2026. A total of 17 volunteers participated in the event at the Iowa DNR Manchester Fish Hatchery. This group consisted of HFFA and TU members, as well as Dan Kirby and Caleb Schnitzler, DNR Fisheries Biologists. We completed the build in 3 hours. During the event, we had 3 stations. Station one consisted of a Biologist and two volunteers cutting lumber to length. Station 2 was assembling stringers, this is the portion that gives the bank hide its height fish to use, and the boards that stick into the bank. Lastly was main assembly. This is where the main boards are attached to the stringers. The bank hides, weighing in at over 300 lbs., are then stacked with a tractor and loader for storage. This project could not have been completed without the help of everyone who attended. The lumber was purchased through TU with funds that were leftover from a 2024 stream project, along with a generous donation from Grau Logs and Lumber, in Elkader, IA.
